PROS & CONS.



- Good source of vitamins & nutrients

- You lose the best parts of the fruits & vegetables - the fiber!
- · Fruit juices can be high in calories.

SOUND TOO GOOD TO BE TRUE? IT PROBABLY IS.



- · Beware any diet that promises significant weight loss overnight.
- · 1-2 pounds per week is a safe weight loss pace.
- · Any more than that, and you'll likely gain it back - and then some.

PROS

- Lots of (approved) fruits & vegetables
 High in soluble fiber
- No processed, refined or sweetened

CONS

- Low in calcium and vitamin D
- · Can be hard to follow; may not be



Great for people with celiac disease or a gluten sensitivity who are unable to process gluten, a protein that naturally occurs in wheat & other grains

· No proof that a gluten-free diet will help you lose weight - in fact, some gluten-free foods can actually be



SUPER FOODS or other "magic bullets" exist that will

melt away fat while you sleep.

POPULAR EXTREME DIETS

- like those where you eat nothing but cabbage soup or grapefruit - might result in a fast weight loss, but:



- · Diets that restrict are not sustainable.
- · When you eventually resume regular eating, you'll likely gain it back.
